



Around Lithuania at 32 of Bizarre Glamping Spots: Futuristic Glass Domes, Repurposed Train Cars, and Sleeping Among Wild Deer

As glamping becomes an increasingly popular vacation option, Lithuania has put together a map revealing the top 32 glamping spots in the country. Campers in Lithuania can spend the night in a train car turned hotel, climb up a treehouse for adults, and bond directly with wildlife in deep Lithuanian forests.

August 18, 2021. With bookings for camping slots across the EU and U.S. increasing by [500%](#), glamping —a portmanteau of "glamorous" and "camping" describing a style of luxury camping with

amenities and, sometimes, resort-style services—is one particular camping option growing in popularity both in Lithuania and abroad. Combining the quietude of nature and the comforts of civilization, it is suitable not only for a leisurely weekend getaway but also for boosting work productivity.

[Lithuania Travel](#)—the country's national tourism development agency—has put together a [new map](#) of one-of-a-kind glamping spots in the country, which include tree houses, forest domes, and futuristic compact houses. Below is a list introducing 5 of many bizarre glamping spots in Lithuania.

1. Treehouse. Nested amid the tall century-old pine trees of the Anykščiai Regional Park, the [Anykščiai Treehouses](#) come with all the essential amenities, while others are equipped with spacious terraces—perfect for watching sunrises and sunsets. As of today, there are two treehouse types available along the country's river Šventoji—ones intended for families with children and others designed for larger groups of up to 8 guests. Before dozing off to the soothing murmur of pine trees, visitors have the chance to relax in a hot sauna and jump into the nearby pond for a refreshing swim.

2. Forest domes. Surrounded by nature close to the capital Vilnius, [Forest Domes](#) are perfect for a romantic getaway from the hustle-bustle of everyday life. Transformed from a sand quarry in the Kuosinė village, this new glamping spot could compete with the country's most renowned hotels as it provides access to a jacuzzi, a private kitchen, and even the opportunity to enjoy classical or Thai massage. While the guests are also granted access to a barbecue area, those who want to take a break from cooking, have the chance to indulge in delicious locally made organic meals and snacks.

3. A night in a train car. An old train car that for three decades transported passengers between Vilnius and Moscow has been repurposed into a [unique accommodation option](#) in the resort town Palanga. The German-made train car has preserved all of its original authentic interior and houses one double and nine four-person compartments. With the price for an overnight stay as low as €10, this is one of the most budget-friendly accommodation options in Palanga particularly suitable for those who are looking for a one of a kind glamping experience.

4. Svencelė. Located in the village Svencelė—Lithuania's kitesurfing and sailing mecca on the shores of the Curonian Lagoon—the glamping area "[Svencelė](#)" offers a variety of comfortable accommodation options, among which are the futuristic container cabins. They come in several types including the more budget-friendly ones as well as those offering a premium view of the Curonian Lagoon. Though Svencelė is particularly popular among water sports enthusiasts, many people choose this town as a getaway destination just to enjoy the peace and quiet of nature and gaze at their adrenaline-loving fellow campers out in the distance.

5. Bonding with wildlife. Situated on the outskirts of Anykščiai Regional Park, the [Closer to Nature](#) glamping spot offers visitors an exclusive opportunity to spend the night in a cabin surrounded by a family of wild deer. The large windows of the cabin make it perfect for observing the deer in their natural habitat and interacting with the beauty of wildlife without disrupting it. While this intense yet deeply relaxing natural experience on itself is ideal for restoring one's natural sleep-wake cycle, the visitors also have the opportunity to top the day off by enjoying a hot sauna or going for some light canoeing.
