

Parlamentarium celebrates its 10th anniversary

In October, the European Parliament's Visitors' Centre will celebrate its 10th anniversary. <u>The Parlamentarium</u> has welcomed over 2.5 million visitors since it opened with a mission to explain Parliament's key role in European democracy and to take citizens on a journey through European integration. To mark this occasion, the Parlamentarium has added two new media stations featuring key topics on



Parliament's agenda. These include climate change, digital transition and <u>the Conference on the Future of Europe</u>. One of the new interactive stations allows citizens to discover the opinions of Parliament's leaders on the most relevant topics affecting Europe, while the other invites them to find out how Parliament addresses the most pressing issues on the European agenda. <u>Visits to the Parlamentarium are free and available in 24 languages.</u>

Fake for Real - extended until February 2022



Visitors now have three more months to explore this fascinating temporary exhibition at the House of European History, featuring 200 remarkable artefacts from across Europe! Fake For Real explores the history of forgery and fake news from antiquity to the present. Learn how falsified data, media and products have been used to advance careers, increase political power and target consumers throughout history. Entrance is free but visits must be booked online in advance. And if you can't visit in person, the curators of the exhibition have put together a virtual visit on Youtube.

Brussels Hemicycle and European Parliament in Strasbourg open for individual visitors

The European Parliament in France will once again take part in the annual European Heritage Days. <u>Visit us in Strasbourg</u> and find European History, walking tours, and pop-up historical performances. <u>Discover the</u> <u>Hemicycle</u> with the help of a multimedia guided visit or an interactive presentation in French, English, Dutch or other languages, upon availability, about the functioning of Parliament at the crossroads of European cultures, and explore how to contribute to the Conference on the Future of Europe. Join the House of European History team to delve into the history of the Eastman building and meet Simone Veil and Robert Schuman in a <u>pop-up</u> <u>historical performance.</u> out more about the institution that represents 446 million European citizens and plays an essential role in the European Union's decision-making process. The day will also be an opportunity to discover the Conference on the Future of Europe, a unique opportunity to have your say on the direction the European Union should take in the years to come. In Île-de-France, <u>the Jean Monnet</u> <u>House</u> will offer guided tours of the exhibition. Also on the programme: a talk about the artwork on display, a workshop about plants and an outdoor performance in the European Garden.
