Visit the new Info Hub and ICONIC temporary exhibition

"ICONIC - defending freedom and democracy since 1955" is an exhibition curated especially for the European Parliament, by the World Press Photo foundation. This exhibition presents 19 photos that have won the "World Press Photo of the Year" competition since 1955. Each photo begs us reflect on how an iconic image contributes to defend democracy and reminds us that many problems we are facing today, we have faced before. The exhibition

Attend a plenary session in the European Parliament in Strasbourg

Anybody can watch European democracy in action! Members of the European Parliament meet up to 12 times a year in Strasbourg to debate and pass laws during a plenary session. Visitors can attend these sessions and follow the debate from the gallery. Groups of 10-100 people can book a visit including an interactive presentation by a European Parliament staff member. Europa Experiences

After Berlin, Copenhagen, Helsinki, Ljubljana and Tallinn, Paris is the newest city to host a Europa Experience. 


17-18 September, 10:00-18:00 Heritage Days in France




24 September, 10:00-18:00 **Multilingualism Day**


